Canadian Shuffleboard Congress - Hall of Fame

Doreen Hegan

Doreen began playing shuffleboard in Kingston, Ontario in 1992. She has represented the Eastern Ontario Shuffleboard Association (EOSA) at the Canadian Championships on eight different occasions beginning in 1993 until 2005. In September of 2005, Doreen moved from Kingston to Victoria to be with her husband and fellow Hall of Fame inductee, Leigh Hegan. Doreen has represented Vancouver Island Shuffleboard Association (VISA) at the Canadian Championships on three different occasions including this year in Victoria. Although she has not won a Canadian Championship at this point, she has proven to be a serious contender in the last few years, and it may be only a matter of time before that elusive Canadian Championship is won.

Throughout her involvement with shuffleboard, Doreen has been an avid supporter and promoter of the game. The work that Doreen did while in Kingston for EOSA was invaluable to that charter. Doreen was a member of EOSA executive from 2003 to 2005. She was a "core" member of the Championship Committee for the 2004 Canadian Championships which were held in Kingston. Her countless hours of work helped make that Championship a success. From fundraising, organizing events, handling the finances, there was not too many "hats" that Doreen did not wear. Her departure from Kingston in 2005 certainly left a void that to this day has not been replaced.

After Doreen moved to Victoria, she joined VISA. She has become an extremely valuable member of their charter. Doreen has served on the executive in Victoria since 2009. She has brought the same work ethic and enthusiasm that she displayed in Kingston to Victoria. She is once again a core

member of the Championship Committee for this years Championships.

In 2006, Doreen was elected to the Canadian Shuffleboard Congress (CSC) executive as Secretary-Treasurer. It is a position that she has held to this day. Doreen's contributions as a member of Congress Executive have been tremendous. In her role as Congress Treasurer she has taken great care of the Congress Financials. From collecting rule book sales, Charter affiliation fees, CSC equities, Hall of Fame expenses, executive stipends and CAPO royalties which she worked very hard to re-establish after Congress did not receive any money for several years. Doreen's financial reports are always well reported and beyond question. But this is only a small part of her contribution to CSC. In her role as Secretary, she creates the Congress newsletter twice a year as well as the AGM Agenda/Minutes. But perhaps her most significant role has been the rebuilding and maintenance of the Congress website. When the original Congress website host shut down, Doreen, with some advise from Theresa Lynk, rebuilt the current congress website. She has maintained this website since. It is one of the most valuable and used assets that Congress has. Doreen has done a tremendous job in keeping the website current and up-to-date.

There is not a lot that goes on in Canadian Shuffleboard that is not posted somewhere on the website. The number of hours that Doreen has committed to keeping this up-to-date is huge.

Doreen does all of this work for one main reason, her love of the game. Her work and involvement in the game over the last 20 years are limitless and above reproach. She is still an active member of the game and hopefully will be for years to come. She is truly deserving of being a member of the Canadian Shuffleboard Congress Hall of Fame as a Builder.
