It sounds very exciting with the Canadians being hosted at the same time as Oktoberfest, its 38th annual festival from October 6-14, 2006. I would like to take this opportunity to thank our past CSC Executive, Rick, Jamie and Lorrie, for a job well done last year. It was a pleasure working with these three individuals.

I am very proud to be writing this opening article to our first newsletter of 2006 as the President of the Canadian Shuffleboard Congress. It has been no secret that I have wanted to represent the CSC as their President for several years. So, now that I am

"Pres", as one of my team mates on Thursday league calls me, what are my plans and goals for Congress:

-Reduction of flight costs to the Canadians, and possibly the Canadian Open and other Opens where there is adequate participation to warrant a discount. If you have not already done so, please provide Lorrie Guillaume, our Secretary-Treasurer, with flight particulars, so we can gather statistics to determine how much of a discount we would be entitled to. During my initial discussion with WestJet and Canadian Airlines, we would likely receive a 10% discount, which initially doesn't sound like much, however, when you multiply that by the number of representatives participating at the Canadians, or attending the Canadian Open, this could be significant.

-National Sponsorship. This is something all past Presidents have been working on as it is a challenging endeavour. I have been in contact with a possible National sponsor and encourage any player or players to advise me of any other possible National sponsors.

-Reprinting and Updating our Rule Book. The last time the Rule Books were printed was some 10 years ago. Lorrie has converted the contents of the Rule Book into a Word document, and I am in the process of adding rules passed over the past 10 years, and Lorrie has updated the winners and Host Cities. Once this is done, we will be providing copies to each Charter, with the changes marked, for review and comments. We are looking into the cost of reprinting the Rule Books.

-New Canadian logo. Contest – see details on page 10. Our current logo noted here has been around for many years, however, it really isn't reflective of our country or our sport. A logo, especially one



that really catches people's interest, is important to an Association. It is valuable when communicating and negotiating for sponsorship funds. It is also an identifying brand and makes everyone proud.

-Further contact with Maritime provinces to encourage new charters to join the CSC.

Please, if any charter or individual player has ideas and thoughts for the promotion and advancement of our game that we love, please email or phone me. We can only grow, and be more successful, if we all work together.

Brian and I are looking forward to meeting up with everyone again at the Canadian Open, Alberta Open and to end off our year, at Kitchener, Ontario for the 2006 Canadian Shuffleboard Championships.

HALL OF FAME

The First Canadian Shuffleboard Congress Hall of Fame Inductions!

Inductees 2005: Frank Brown (Builder); Don McAlpine (Builder); Joanie Millar (Player)

At the Awards Banquet on October 8, 2005, we were privileged to be a part of the first Canadian Shuffleboard Congress Hall of Fame Inductee presentations. There were three very deserving shuffleboard players who were inducted into the CSC Hall of Fame, two as Builders, and one as a Player.

The awards started off with a special presentation by Rick Litman, President of CSC, to a long time shuffleboard player and a past resident of Victoria, **Millie Jensen**. Millie is an individual who has tirelessly supported this sport for many years and has not received true recognition for her commitment to the love of this game. Rick presented Millie with a silver wall plaque. Millie accepted this award graciously and thanked all her shuffleboard family for many wonderful memories over the years.

Doug Grant, the President of the Vancouver Island Shuffleboard Association, was the presenter to induct **Don McAlpine**, of Victoria, BC, as a Builder into the CSC Hall of Fame. Don owned all the shuffleboard tables from Victoria clear up to the end of Vancouver Island for many years. Don and his partner, Jack Kraeling, would travel up and down the Island tending to their boards. Their company, Automatic Music, also owned all the coin operated games and juke boxes that were in all the pubs and Legions on the Island.

Don stored shuffleboards at his home and would transport and set them up for the Vancouver Island Shuffleboard Association's Spring Tournament and Charter Playdowns. He also would transport the tables across the water to Vancouver for the B.C. Shuffleboard Association to use for their tournaments. Don made arrangements to give 4 shuffleboards to each of Vancouver Island Shuffleboard Association and B.C. Shuffleboard Association as he wanted to ensure that shuffleboard, the sport he truly loved and tirelessly promoted, would carry on for years to come.

Don McAlpine was truly a Builder of table shuffleboard and a deserving inductee into the Canadian Shuffleboard Congress Hall of Fame.

Joanie Millar was the presenter for the induction of **Frank Brown** into the CSC Hall of Fame. Frank Brown was associated with shuffleboard as far back as 1951 through the Elks Club in Vancouver, B.C.

In 1951, there were only four regulation shuffleboards in existence in Canada and due to Frank Brown's outstanding organizing capabilities, along with a few shuffleboard enthusiasts, like Sandy Sandquist, Bert Henry, Harold Winch, Bob Zeelander, and others, the first Singles shuffleboard tournament in British Columbia, and possibly Canada, was played. Frank went on to organize the first Rules of Play in 1954, known as the Canadian Shuffleboard Congress Rules, which are basically the rules of play we use today, with some changes to enhance the game.

Frank Brown was the first Executive Secretary of the Canadian Shuffleboard Congress and held this position for several years. Frank was also the Editor and inspiration for the National Shuffleboard News which was distributed across Canada, starting in 1964.

Frank Brown wrote the Birth of Table Shuffleboard in Canada and presented this at the Annual General Meeting in October 1976 held in Victoria, B.C. This commentary is the Preamble in the Canadian Shuffleboard Congress Official Rules and Regulations booklet.

Frank Brown is one of few individuals who did so much to make table shuffleboard the recognized game it is today across Canada. He is very deserving of the honour of being one of the first Builder inductees into the Canadian Shuffleboard Congress Hall of Fame.

Brian Burchynsky, Past-President of CSC, and Lorraine Burchynsky, President of BCSA, jointly presented the perpetual Players' plaque to their very special friend, **Joanie Millar**

Joanie is the first Player recognized for her skill and many accomplishments in the game of shuffleboard. Lorraine started off by thanking **Joanie** for being a very large part of her involvement in shuffleboard and for introducing her to so many shuffleboard friends across Canada, and the United States. She, with husband Brian, travelled to many tournaments throughout Canada, with the most memorable being the Canadians. Lorraine stated that Joanie was always a great supporter of the game, always volunteered to fundraise, organize, etc. and was always there to make us laugh and to entertain us. Brian then told a couple of cute stories of Joanie and Brian playing together in the Mixed Doubles.

He thanked Joanie for being his partner throughout the years, and in particular, when they won the Canadian Mixed Doubles event three times.

Joanie has always been a supporter and promoter of the game of shuffleboard and a tough competitor. Her accomplishments are extensive. She has travelled across Canada to play shuffleboard many, many times in the Canadian Championships – 15 times a winner and many times as runner-up. Joanie almost accomplished a Canadian Triple Crown in 1982 with two firsts and a second. Joanie was also the first woman, and first Canadian, to be inducted into the Pacific Northwest Shuffleboard Hall of Fame in the United States.

All players across Canada know Joanie or know of Joanie. Shuffleboard is her life. Joanie always volunteers to help. She is currently and has been for some 20 years, an executive member of the B.C. Shuffleboard Association. Joanie is the Canadian Ambassador to Shuffleboard. She loves to meet new people and quickly becomes their lifetime friend.

Here are a couple of comments from son Ian:

If there was a Hall of Fame for Moms, I think she should be inducted into that as well.

The Shuffleboard Hall of Fame, couldn't have happened to a nicer or better person, if anything, for her competitiveness and her heart and the fact that she's just a heck of a lot of fun to be around, even when the chips are down, she'll be the first to break into a song and lift the spirits of those around her and all is forgotten. Congratulations Mom!

Joanie says her memories of shuffleboard are not just of wins and losses but especially of the pleasures of meeting so many wonderful people throughout Canada and the USA. The one thing Joanie will cherish forever and ever is the hundreds of friends that she has met throughout her 35 years of playing her favourite game of shuffleboard. Joanie also would like to thank her Manager (Lorraine, who haphazardly manages her shuffleboard career). She would also like to specifically thank her partners in the Mixed Doubles, Jimmy Hay and Brian Burchynsky, partner in the Ladies, Eileen Elliott and Theresa Cartwright, with whom she has won Canadian Championships, and others she has played with throughout the years as well.

As quoted by Hall of Fame Committee member, Harvey Groleau, "**Joanie** has had a stellar and long shuffleboard career. She is, I believe, the shuffleboard player with the most Canadian Championship titles. Her sportsmanship and class are examples for all to admire. Her records speak for themselves. I can only say that it is an honour and a privilege to induct this legend into the Canadian Shuffleboard Congress Hall of Fame."

The Builders' and Players' perpetual plaques will be displayed each year at the Canadian Shuffleboard Championships for all to see and admire.

GUIDELINES FOR INDUCTION INTO CANADIAN SHUFFLEBOARD CONGRESS

PLAYER:

1. Person must have a minimum of 2 - Provincial Championships and 2 - Canadian Championships
-Provide particulars, including year, event and partners, if applicable (ie: 1989 Mixed doubles (Partner's name(s))

BUILDER:

1. Person must have held offices/chairs at Provincial and/or National levels for a minimum of 10 years. Provide details in writing.
2. Person must have promoted our sport extensively (ie: involvement in organizing, league play, tournaments, fund raising, recruitment of new players, new sponsorships, expansion of new establishment of shuffleboard, media awareness. Provide details in writing.

PLAYER AND/OR BUILDER:

3. Provide completed Induction [Nomination form](#) which includes a written testimony of his or her contributions. This Form must be signed by the Nominating Person as well as 11 other members of their Charter.

4. Player and/or Builder must be in good standing with his or her Charter for a minimum of 10 years. Confirmation to be provided in writing by the current President of that Charter.

5. Supply a minimum of 1 – 8x10 photo of inductee (video, DVD optional)

6. Submit all requirements noted above to the CSC Hall of Fame Committee six (6) months prior to the annual CSC Championships.

- The **CSC President (Lorraine Burchynsky)** 306B East 4th Street, North Vancouver, B.C. V7L 1J2
- Distribution of information will be done by the CSC President to the H.O.F. committee.
- H.O.F. committee is to be a five (5) person Committee from at least 3 different Charters.

A decision will be made by the CSC Hall of Fame Committee three (3) months prior to the annual C.S.C. Championships and selected candidates will be honored at that year's Championships Banquet.

Any candidates not selected shall be kept on file for at least three (3) years and may be reconsidered by the H.O.F. Committee at a later date.

No more than three (3) candidates shall be inducted in any calendar year.

Induction into the CSC Hall of Fame shall be final and forever with honor and without prejudice.
