CONGRESS NEWS

Congratulations to the Shuffleboard Association of Alberta (SAA) for an outstanding job of hosting the 2007 Canadian Shuffleboard Championships in Edmonton, Alberta. It was a stellar and memorable week. What a great set-up at the Executive Royal Inn. Special thanks to Vern, Marion, Bill, Carol, David, Cheryl, Toni, and many other members of the SAA for all their hard work.

The Hospitality Event was great fun, starting off with a Red Hot Poker game won by Mike Provencher of Victoria, followed by Name that Tune.

The tournament itself ran flawlessly with all events finishing within a reasonable time. The continental breakfast and meals at lunch were a nice addition. The playoffs were exciting and my congratulations to all the Canadian Champions. The Awards Banquet on the Saturday evening had a wonderful buffet, followed by the recognition of all participants at the Canadians, with the main presentations to our Canadian Champions of 2007 (more details on page 5).

Presentations of maple leaf plaques (donated by Leigh) were presented to the last 3 year's winners, namely, myself as the first winner in Victoria, with Leigh Hegan being triumphant the past two years in Kitchener and Edmonton.

Rod, Liz, Char, Marlowe, Shelley and many other members of the Saskatchewan Shuffleboard Association (SSA) www.geocities.com/saskshuffleboard have their plans well underway for the 2008 Canadians being held October 6 – 11, 2008 in Regina. The Regina Inn www.reginainn.com is the hotel venue with great room rates starting at \$90. More information has been posted to the CSC website.

So, what has your Congress Executive been working on?

- **Westjet 10% discount.** A "Conference" discount of 10% is available to any players and spectators, planning to attend the Canadian Championships if travelling by Westjet. This year, we have expanded this discount to include another 4 tournaments throughout the year, namely the Canadian, Alberta, Saskatchewan and Manitoba Opens. The booking account # is QC5038. Information sheets and booking forms have been distributed to your Charter contacts. You can also view same on the Congress Website at http://www.geocities.com/cdnshuffleboard/Tourn_Open.html. This expansion may help us in achieving the 50 paid flights for the year which would then entitle Congress to a complimentary ticket for a raffle/fundraiser at this year's Canadians.
- Our CSC logo has been well received by players and spectators. The logo was initially designed by two members of the B.C. Shuffleboard Association, namely Mike Billings and Chuck Docile. The finishing touches and design were put together by Action Athletics who supplies the BCSA with their tournament shirts. 
- **3 way tie for 1st place.** This was discussed at the AGM and it was decided not to change the rule. Please refer to the Playoff Format booklet on the website for confirmation of the rule.
- **CAPO royalties.** Thanks to Doreen Clark's persistence with CAPO, Congress recently received a cheque from CAPO in the amount of \$305.28 for royalties for 2006 and 2007. Unfortunately, due to the time involved, CAPO does not wish to go back before 2006 but they have agreed to continue to pay the royalties in the future. They have also agreed to supply the host charter with 3 cases of "Congress" wax for the Canadians each year, which was part of the original agreement with CAPO. In order for Congress to capitalize on future royalties, we need your help. Doreen will create a spreadsheet to log your purchases of "Congress" wax and we ask that you submit it along with copies of the invoice, to Doreen, on a quarterly basis. We could also use your assistance to confirm purchases of "Congress" wax from other entities i.e. Legions, ANAF Clubs, pubs, etc. Once Doreen gets a current price list from CAPO, she will provide each charter with same. **Note:** We currently receive 30¢ for each can of "Congress" wax sold. By ordering "Congress" wax from CAPO, we will increase our royalties.

- **Hall of Fame.** There was again lots of positive feedback about the CSC Hall of Fame at the AGM, and the following week. The recommended changes have been implemented (refer to website).

- **Congress Weights.** It was confirmed at the 2008 Championships that Congress currently has 8 sets of good weights.
- **Cases for our perpetual Hall of Fame plaques** (Player and Builder). Jamie McCrimmon (1st Vice-President) volunteered to take care of supplying cases for HOF plaques.
- **Rules & Regulations.** Updated on website, in accordance with AGM.
- **Canadian Open** is once again being hosted by Vancouver Island Shuffleboard Association at the Esquimalt Legion on Easter weekend (March 20-23). Remember to take advantage of the Westjet conference discount.
- **Expansion of our Game.** Harvey Groleau of the Manitoba Shuffleboard Assoc. (MSA) made a great proposal at the AGM. Congress needs to get more information on our website about the game of shuffleboard, in Canada, in order to get 'the word out' and to encourage more players. We are forming a Committee to do some research and work on the wording. Please let either myself or Doreen know if you are interested in joining this Committee.

On closing, Brian and I are looking forward to meeting up with everyone again at the upcoming tournaments and, of course, at the 2008 Canadian Shuffleboard Championships in Regina, Saskatchewan.

2007 HALL OF FAME

Sandy Sandquist - Builder

During the Executive meeting of the British Columbia Shuffleboard Association in the early part of 1964, it was suggested by Mr. H.A. (Sandy) Sandquist that we attempt to organize Annual Tournaments. Mr. Sandquist suggested the tournament play be organized along the same lines as curling, with each Province in the Dominion of Canada being invited to participate. Thus the plans were laid for the hosting of the first Dominion Shuffleboard Tournament, which was held in Toronto, Ontario during Grey Cup week in 1964.

Dave Neufeld – Builder

Dave Neufeld was one of the individuals instrumental in organizing the Dominion Council, known as the Canadian Shuffleboard Congress. Dave was the first elected President of the Canadian Shuffleboard Congress (CSC).

Dave was also the President of the Alberta Shuffleboard Association. He lived and played shuffleboard in Edmonton, Alberta.

Both Sandy Sandquist and Dave Neufeld were Pioneers and Builders of table shuffleboard across Canada and deserving inductees into the Canadian Shuffleboard Congress Hall of Fame.



Art Evans – Builder and Player

Art started playing shuffleboard in 1967 in Lethbridge, Alberta. He won the Men's Doubles with Doug McKenzie in 1968.

In January 1969, Art was transferred to Regina, Saskatchewan. In the Fall of 1969, Art Evans, Al Cooper & Kent Conn formed the Saskatchewan Shuffleboard Association & League. Art became the first President of the League.

In 1971, Art made a motion at the Canadian Congress AGM to have Women's Singles & Doubles events introduced at the Canadian Championships. In 1972 in St. John, New Brunswick, the Ladies events were first played & the Saskatchewan Ladies won both events.

In 1973 Art made a motion at the Canadian Congress Annual General Meeting to introduce a Mixed Doubles event into the Canadian Championships.

In 1974 Art won the Men's Singles event at the Canadians held in Winnipeg, Manitoba. Art also made the motion that all charters have matching team shirts while playing in the Canadian Championships.

Art Evans is a Founder, Player, Mentor, Teacher, Fantastic cheerleader, and above all, a very special Family Man and Friend.

Sharon Juhlke - Player



Sharon Payne (now Juhlke) started playing in 1966 as a member of the Vancouver Island and the Islands Shuffleboard Association (VISA). In 1977, she won the Ladies Doubles with Millie Jensen and the Mixed Doubles with Wayne Jensen to represent VISA in St. John, New Brunswick at the Canadian Shuffleboard Championships. Sharon's first win at the Canadians was in 1978 in Edmonton Alberta as the Ladies Singles Champion.

Sharon Juhlke (Payne) has acquired 5 Ladies Singles championships. She has also won the Ladies Doubles 7 times with 3 different partners and the Mixed event with partner, Kabal Bimb.



Jim Nicoll - Player

Mike Harley of New Brunswick Shuffleboard Association presenting Jim Nicoll with his first Canadian Men's Singles, won in 1983.

Jim's passion for the game of shuffleboard and his quiet professionalism is what makes him an admired champion. Over his career playing for the Shuffleboard Association of Alberta, he has earned 13 Canadian Shuffleboard Championships.

Jim has won the Men's Doubles 6 times with partner Kelly Restau and the Mixed Doubles once with Diana Madsen. He has won the Men's Singles 6 times and is the only competitor to date to have won the Singles for 3 consecutive years (1987, 88 and 89).

Kelly Restau (centre left) with partner Jim Nicholl (centre right), winners of the Men's Doubles event at the Canadian Shuffleboard Championships held in 1994 at Winnipeg, Manitoba.

Kelly has won the Men's Doubles 5 times with partner, Jim Nicholl. He also won the Mixed Doubles in 1994 with partner, Kathy Auvigne and captured the Canadian title once as the Men's Singles champion in 1990.

Kelly, like his Men's partner, Jim, is a quiet and professional champion. Over his career playing for the Shuffleboard Association of Alberta, he has acquired 7 Canadian Championships.

All three players, Sharon, Jim and Kelly have most certainly earned a place in the Canadian Shuffleboard "Hall of Fame" as Players
